aclu he was barred from the country until spring of 2010 when secretary of state hillary clinton finally lifted the ban in what i believe ramadan attempts to set the record straight laying out the basic ideas he stands for in clear and accessible prose he describes the book as a work of clarification directed at ordinary citizens politicians journalists and others who are curious or skeptical about his positions aware that that he is dealing with emotional issues ramadan tries to get past the barriers of prejudice and misunderstanding to speak directly from the heart to his muslim and non muslim readers alike in particular he calls on western muslims to escape the mental social cultural and religious ghettos they have created for themselves and become full partners in the democratic societies in which they live at the same time he calls for the rest of us to recognize our muslim neighbors as citizens with rights and responsibilities the same as ours his vision is of a future in which a shared and confident pluralism becomes a reality at last
